Notes:	The rate of PTSD in Veterans of the recent Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts is estimated from 8% to 20%. Veterans of other combat theaters are also known to carry a greater risk for trauma related disorders than the non-military population. This presentation will review several evidence-based therapy options for addressing trauma related symptoms of combat Veterans. Attention will be given to identifying important commonalities in the treatment rationales and interventions among these various models. Unique considerations in applying these commonalities to survivors of combat related trauma in the context of military service and culture will be discussed. Among these considerations will also be an exploration and discussion of co-related concepts such moral injury, suicidality, and co-morbid substance use pertinent to the Veteran population.
