✓ Accreditation

✓ Career and Employment Options

- Consider whether the program offers strong job placement support.

✓ Program Fit

- **Location:** Cost of living, proximity to family, and lifestyle preferences.
- **Faculty:** Review faculty research interests and mentorship opportunities.
- **Research Opportunities:** Labs, grants, and projects aligned with your goals.
- **Program Culture:** Cohort size, diversity, and support systems.

✓ Financial Considerations

- Compare tuition and fees across programs.
- Look for assistantships (teaching/research) and stipends.
- Explore scholarships, grants, and loan options early.
- Understand long-term debt implications.

✓ Program Structure and Requirements

- Length of program and time to degree.
- Internship or practicum requirements.
- Licensure preparation and pass rates.
